# Klinger Lake Trail

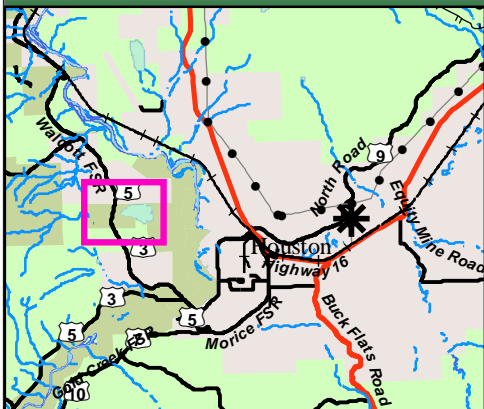
Difficulty: Easy Cell Coverage: Yes  
Trail Length: 200 meters to lake Trail loop: 1.2 km  
Distance from Town: 14.3 km

Klinger Lake is a very popular all season fishing destination. During winter the lake is well used for ice fishing. The trail from the Wallcott is usually well packed from snow machine traffic to allow for a short 200 meter walk from the road to the lake. The trail follows along the outside of a log fence. The fenced area is crown land that is being leased for a grazing permit.

During summer months the wide trail allows for canoes and other small boats to be carried down to the lake. The lake is non-motorized but electric motors can be used. The site at the lake contains one picnic table and fire pit. There is also a short walking loop 1.2 km.

-Driving Directions - Exit highway 16 west of Houston, onto the Morice River FSR. Drive to 4 km and turn right onto the Bymac Road. Travel 1.5 km on the Bymac Road then turn left and cross the Morice River on the Wallcott bridge. You are now on the Wallcott Road (also Called the Telkwa Forest Service Road) drive 4.7 km and on your right will be a small pullout and the trail sign.
